

United States - Mexico - Canada Agreement

Why is it important?

- The North American Free Trade Agreement has provided duty-free trade with Canada and Mexico for the past 25 years.
- Canada and Mexico are two of the U.S. beef industry's Top 5 most important trading partners.
- Trade with Mexico is especially important because of the demand for variety meats like tongue, tripe and heart. In the U.S., these cuts are nearly worthless.
- USMCA, or the "new" NAFTA, is necessary for growing beef exports.

By the numbers...

- Iowa is home to approximately 27,000 beef producers.
- Since NAFTA was put in place, U.S. beef trade with Mexico has increased 545%.
- Trade with Canada and Mexico adds \$70 to the value of each head of cattle in Iowa.
- Cattle production provides considerable contributions to lowa's economy, generating \$6.80 billion.
- If USMCA is not approved, United States farmers risk losing \$9.4 billion in total agricultural exports annually. Of that total, \$1.8 billion comes from the cattle industry and \$3.2 billion is from corn and corn co-products.

What is the status?

- May 17 steel and aluminum tariffs lifted
- May 30 draft Statement of Administrative Action submitted, President Trump now has 30 days to send the trade deal to Congress, Congress then has 90 days to vote
- May 30 President Trump tweeted plans to charge 5% tariff on all goods coming from Mexico, because of immigration dispute. An agreement between the countries was reached on Friday, May 31.
- Democratic-held house still has concerns about the agreement, including labor provisions
- June 11 Nearly 1,000 agricultural groups, including NCBA, write a letter to the House of Representatives
 Majority and Minority leaders asking for swift ratification
- June 19 Mexico ratifies the agreement
